FLOOD INFORMATION FORM

To be used in obtaining and transmitting flood water elevations for Survey Division office record files. The elevations can be recorded by level reading, by measurement from bridge floor, in relation to a house, above roadbed or any other dependable, clear manner that fits the situation, the highest order possible to be used. Separate report to be made on each crossing or place obtained.

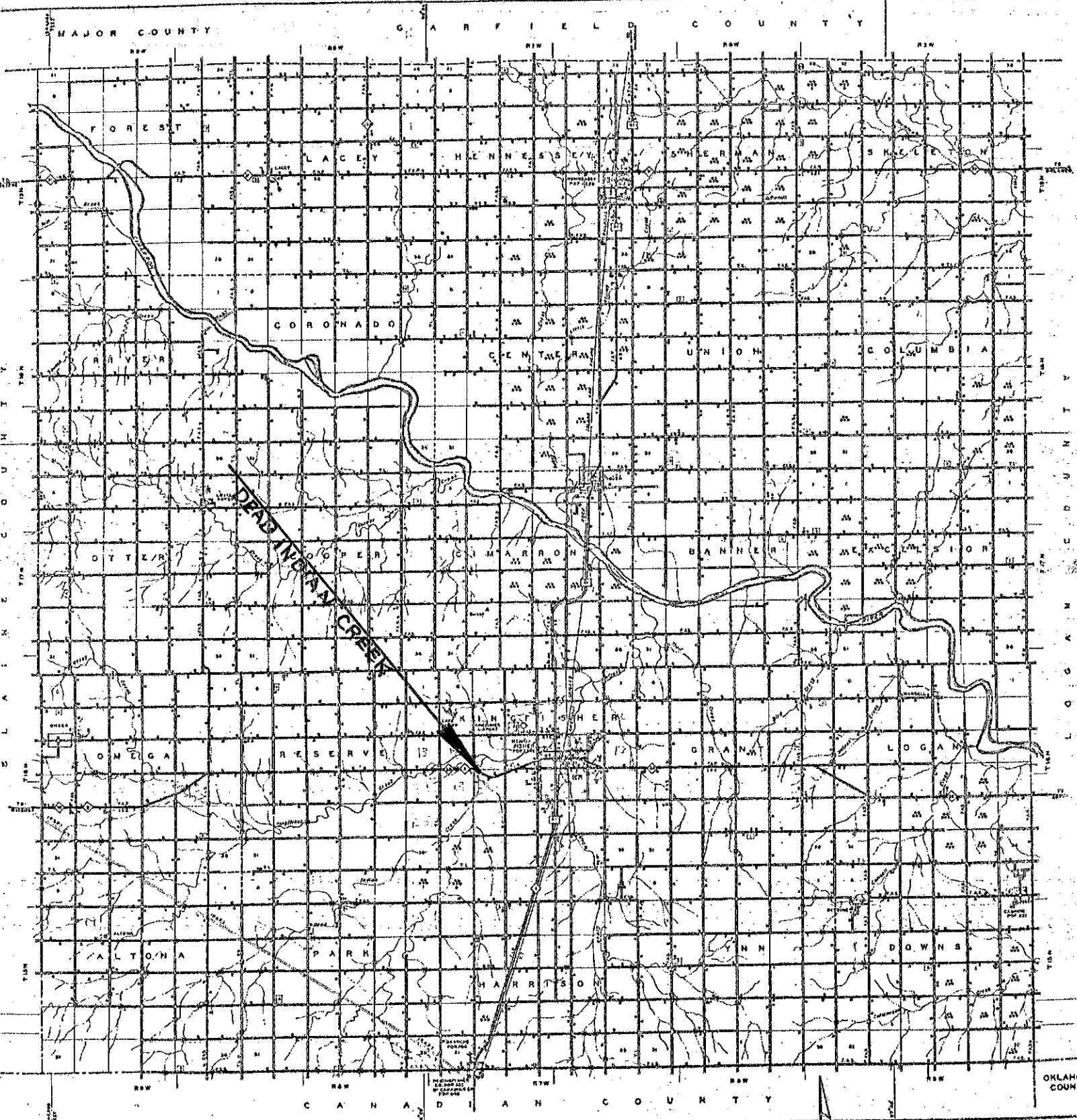
