Subject Highwater information, Mayes & Delaware Counties

1. Transmitted with this letter is 13 copies of S.D. Form 13 depicting highwater information in Mayes & Delaware Counties that occurred the night of September 18, 1975.
2. I talked to several people at Pryor, Adair, Chouteau and Locust Grove. Hubbard talked to people east of Pryor, Salina and at Kansas. They agreed that the cloud formed just west of Pryor and rained hard almost all night. The cloud traveled approx. S 75° E and played out around Kansas. (We received no rain at Tahlequah, but you could see the cloud to the north). At Pryor, they received 8 inches of rain that tapered to 6 inches at Locust Grove.
3. The major creeks at Pryor (Seminole Creek & Pryor Creek) did not get over U.S. 69. It was reported that Seminole Creek west of Pryor got over S.H. 20, but I could find no evidence. Salt Creek at the north edge of Pryor got over US 69 for a while.
4. 1 day was spent obtaining this highwater information.
