

Heavy Rains Flood Some State Roads

Locally heavy rains in northern Oklahoma Sunday night brought creeks above flood stages, but Oklahoma City reported a high rainfall reading at Will Rogers World Airport of only .22 inch.

The highway patrol reported high water on U. S. 81 north of Medford and south of the junction of highways 81, 60 and 64 and on a bridge east of Deer Creek. Water reportedly reached automobile headlight level.

Other Oklahoma City readings were .03 inch at Tinker Field, .09 inch at the North Sewage Plant, and .28 inch at the South Sewage Plant.

Heaviest state amounts reported Sunday night were 1 inch at Ponca City and .79 inch at Gage. Hobart reported .38 inch.

Scattered thundershowers should fall in eastern sections of the state Monday, the weather bureau said, but no rain is predicted for the city area.

Oklahoma City's high Monday should reach 72 after a predicted overnight low of from 50 to 55.
