## Governor Signs Tax Exemption For Farm Feed

**Gary Vetoes Six Measures, Turns 23 Bills Into Law**

Gov. Gary Friday afternoon signed into law legislation granting Oklahoma farmers sales tax exemptions on feed and used farm machinery.

The tax exemption was among 23 bills signed Friday.

Also Friday, the governor announced he has pocket vetoed six measures.

In signing the tax exemption, Gary said, "I am of the opinion that the bill passed by the legislature will not affect the welfare program one single dollar."

The governor pointed out that \$1 millions will be transferred from the general revenue fund to the welfare fund each year. This comes about by a provision that cuts the state tax commission's share for collecting the tax from 3 to 1 percent.

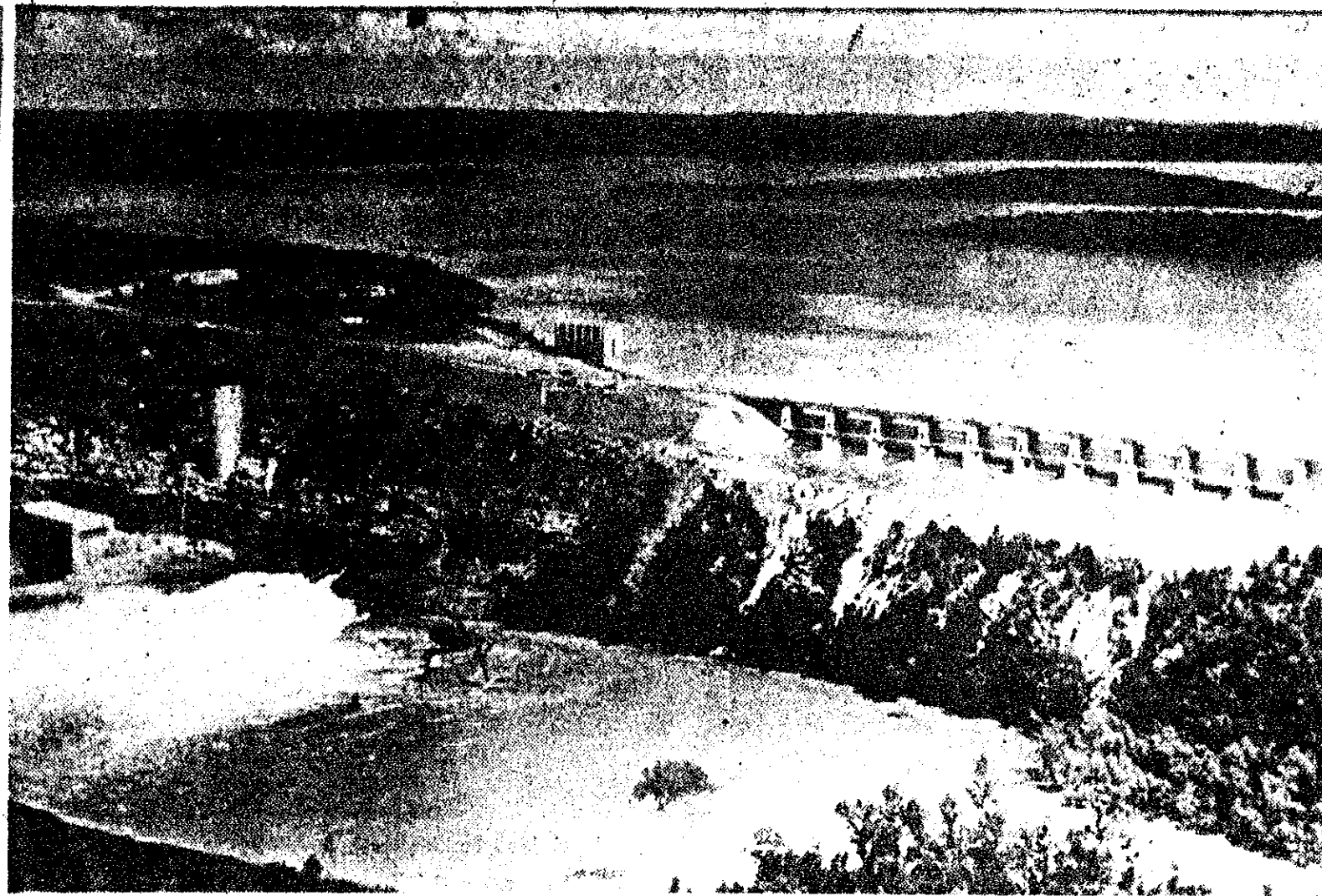

## Order of Dismissal Clears 48 in Suit

Forty-eight defendants in an injunction filed in district court by Oklahoma City school district were cleared Friday when Judge Glen O. Morris signed a dismissal order.

The suit, filed last Monday, still stands against eleven other defendants. It asked that they be ordered to disconnect from a private sewer line running from SW 38 and Drexel to Chester A. Arthur school at SW 49 and Independence.

The school district's petition alleged that the property now owned by the defendants has been connected with the sewer line which is property of the school district, without the required \$50 fee for each connection being paid.
