## Road Blocked After Deluge

Heavy rains in the Red Rock and Dover areas left one highway closed and other roads threatened Thursday night.

Officials in Red Rock said SH 15 was closed at a point two miles west of town after more than three inches of rain Thursday. Water was reported over other roads in the vicinity in low places and Red Rock Creek was running out of its banks at some points.

More than five inches of rain fell in the Dover area and water and mud were reported across U. S. 81 at the Cimarron River bridge two miles south of town. The highway still was open to traffic, however.

Rainfall ranging from showers to more than an inch fell in other areas.

The thundershowers kept high temperatures in the low 90's across the state. Oklahoma City posted 87.

Clear to partly cloudy with a few thundershowers in the forecast across the state for Friday. Highs will range from 85 to 95.

Oklahoma City and vicinity can look for a high of 93 after an over-night low of 68.
