This information to be obtained by all Chiefs of Party in their vicinity in times of unusual high water, or at any time available from a reliable source. The elevations can be recorded by level reading, by measurement from bridge floor, in relation to a house, above roadbed or any other dependable, clear manner that fits the situation, the highest order possible to be used. Separate report to be made on each crossing or place obtained.

Explanatory Remarks This is not an extreme high water and the high water was near 2.0 feet higher in about June of this year but we could find no visible trace of the high water marks of that time.

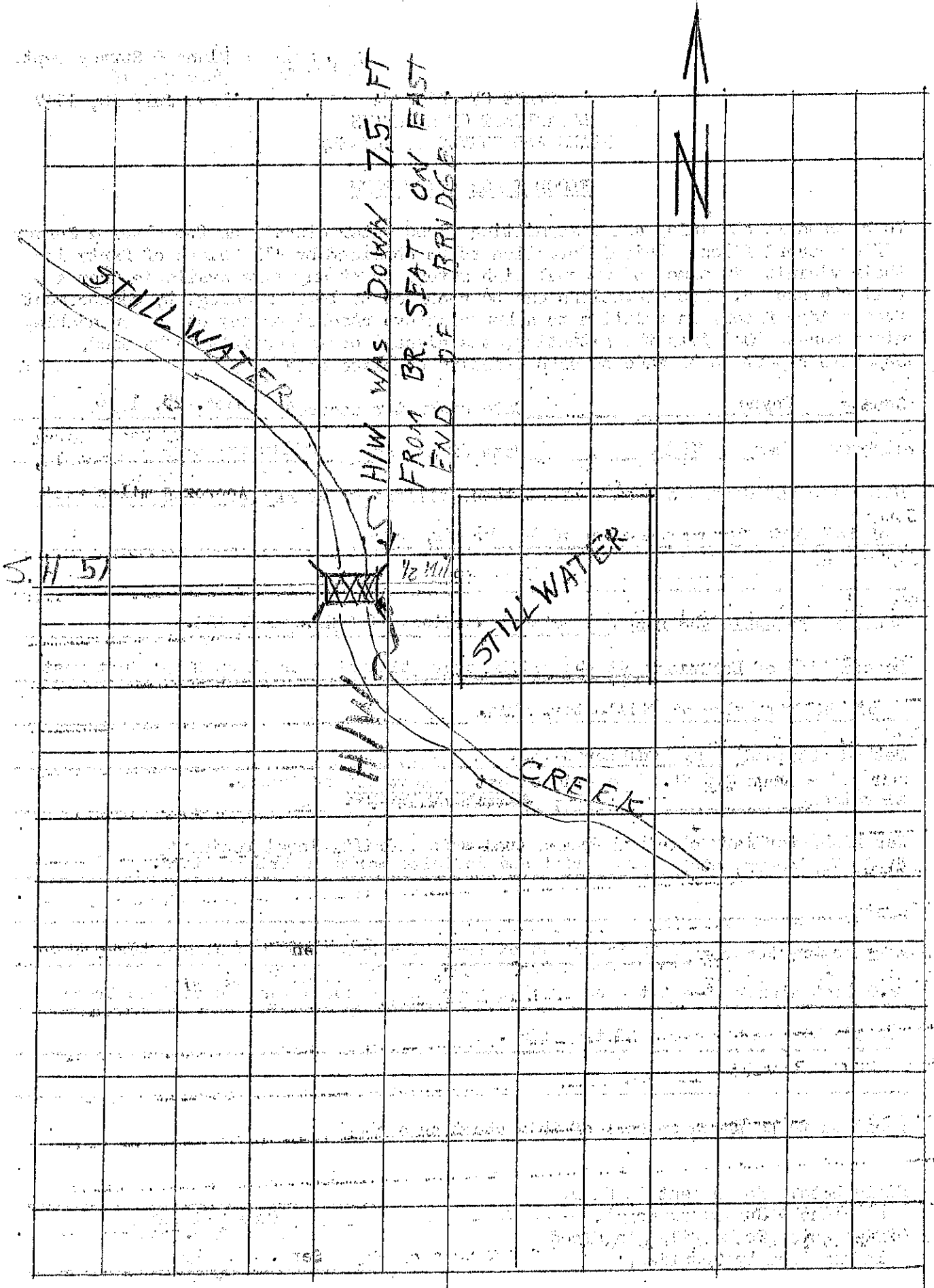
