

What is NRDA?

Natural Resources Damage Assessment Act

- Natural resource =land, water, wildlife, air, cultural sites, etc. owned or managed by govt, including tribes
- Part of Superfund Act, following clean up
- Requires:
 - restoration of natural resources to precontamination condition
 - OR replacement of natural resources
 - OR compensation for natural resources



NRDA Trustee Council

- Restoration, replacement, or compensation determined by a trustee council
- LANL Trustee Council:
 - Federal land mgmt reps (DOE, LANL, FS)
 - State land mgmt reps (NM NR Trustee)
 - Tribes (Santa Clara, San Ildefonso, Jemez, Cochiti)

Process

- First phase: Assessment
 - 6 years
 - Data search; determine injury
- Second phase: Restoration (or....)
 - 3 years?
 - Negotiate projects, land purchase, other compensation
- Contractor
- Monthly meetings

Challenges

<u>Today:</u>

- Complexity of data
- Turnover of members (non-tribal)
- Bureaucratic dynamics
- Sensitivity of pueblo data
- Intertribal conflicts
- In the future:
- Competition among pueblos
- Justice Dept approval
- Funding

What works?

- Relationships, trust built over years
- Understand that everyone is at the table in a professional role; not responsible for situation
- History is accepted, acknowledged and left in its place
- Experts, data gatherers are contractors, hired by group
- Facilitation of meetings
- Rotate meeting locations
- Eat lunch together
