Groundwater/Surface Water Transect Update (E. Kandl)

- Ed Kandl shared that his will hopefully be able to go into the field sometime this month. It has been 6 months since the last data download (September/October 2011).
- The USGS is revamping all the data collected due to complaints collects about "un-user-friendliness" and unusable points.
 - o It is not clear who the communication cables belong to (USGS or Reclamation), but the USGS seemed willing to lend them regardless.
 - Ed needs to download the software from the company. It is assumed that Reclamation will have the other equipment (wrenches, waders, screwdrivers, etc.) available in the storage warehouse. He will also need to get keys from the USGS and MRGCD (for the gates).
- The USGS is completely done with this work with the exception of the last reports. They are still processing the data from the September/October 2011 collection.
 - o It appears that the "complicated" data processing turned out to be the USGS converting the data into their own format. It is assumed that it will be much simpler to convert the ASCII into an Excel file for QA/QC and corrections (atmospheric).
- Ed shared that he intends to keep a "time log" to record the effort and time requirements. This will be provided to the SWM work group in order to estimate the expected work load for single versus double transects. It is hope that this will provide a realistic estimate on the work and time loads.
- Members briefly discussed the need to determine whether or not this data collection needs to continue. The work group will have to make a decision on how to proceed at some time in the future. It was shared that URGWOM does seem to like having this data available they may be able to provide support or funding.

Report out on any CC guidance on how to proceed (Hilary):

- The guidance from the CC update was postponed since Hilary was not in attendance. Instead, Curtis provided an informal update for members.
 - O The current understanding is that the SWM work group to be absorbed into another group, probably the Adaptive Management (AM) implementation team, once formed. - Due to this being an election year, it is expected that the 2013 budget will be delayed until February. It is assumed that Continuing Resolution (CR) will be in place until the inauguration. Usually no new projects get considered under CR, but on-going projects can generally be funded. Congressional staff will be very busy with the deficits, tax cuts, FY13 budget, and FY14 budget, all to be discussed in November/December.
